

# WATER SHUT-OFF

Sometime between 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on Wednesday, June 14<sup>th</sup>, the Macomb City Water Dept. will be shutting off the water to test and calibrate the meter. Estimated time the water will need to be off is maybe an hour. Assuming no trouble is encountered, there will be a NO BOIL order. Also, sandwich signs will be placed at the main entrance and Quail Walk Rd. alerting everyone.

Those residents who are subscribed on our website should receive an email message regarding this water shut-off. Please confirm your Georgetown subscription in order to receive the electronic notification, if you haven't already done so.



## SHRUBBERY TRIMMING

Shrubbery trimming typically begins around July 4th. The trimmers WILL NOT be responsible for any electrical cords and hoses cut during the trimming process. If you have cords/hoses lying on top of the rock, it may be best to remove them. Also, please keep toys, signs, etc. away from

the area so that the workers can have easy access to trim. If you wish to be removed or added to last year's shrub-trimming list, please email the office before June 20<sup>th</sup>

#### **POOL**

All residents are required to have pool passes BEFORE using the pool. You may pick them up during regular office hours.

If you are a tenant, your landlord will need to complete an office form stating you may use the pool.

All pool users are to sign in when entering the pool area. There is a limit of five guests per day. Be sure to use your guest passes!

## WALK AROUND

The Architecture Committee will be completing their walk-a-round of all properties in Georgetown. They will assess any work that needs to be done on each property. Townhomes needing attention will receive a letter with mentioned requiring work such as a roof, fences, power washing, etc. Maintenance funds can be used to power-wash your exterior. Proof that the work was completed will given need to be before reimbursement can be made.

# WEEDS AND GENERAL APPEARANCES

There are several properties for sale in Georgetown currently. Because our townhomes are connected, the appearance of your property reflects on the entire community. Please keep toys, bikes, etc. off the front lawns.

Should a townhome be empty, the homeowner is still responsible for monthly dues and appropriate upkeep with mowing, weeding, etc. Make arrangements for your townhome to be maintained at all times. It can only help with the sale of your home and make your neighbor appreciative.



The Board has received many requests this year for exterior maintenance. vou If are contemplating work on your townhome, there is still plenty of time to complete improvements. The maintenance reserve fund for each townhome can be used (with prior Board approval) to help with the cost of the improvements. Please contact the office if you would like to know how much money is in vour Townhomes with garages add \$89.28 per year and townhomes without garages add \$53.28 per vear. These funds can be used for exterior work such as siding, windows, fencing, etc. It does not cover landscape work.

Golf Green Lawn Care will be applying fertilizer, etc. to the front yard areas this summer. Soon, they will be making a second application. Please watch for small signs near the beginning of your street to be aware when an application has been done.
